At General Assembly in Portland this summer, Unitarians considered how we have been shaped by classism. Who have we excluded from our free and responsible search for meaning? How can we be more welcoming in the future?

MINISTER'S MUSINGS: "PEACE AND LOVE"

When I was born in August of 1960, interracial marriage was illegal in 22 states, including Indiana. The law changed in this state in 1965. In 1967, the Supreme Court made interracial marriage legal in the 16 states that still resisted equality. People argued from the Bible that intermarriage was forbidden. They felt that the court had changed the definition of marriage.

But marriage has always been redefined. In ancient Israel and in 19th century Utah Territory, polygamy was common. Until 1993, some states did not require a husband to get consent from his wife before intercourse. Until recently the law treated women like property or slaves. We are moving slowly toward racial and gender equality. I think of how much we have progressed in the 55 years I have been alive.

Yet the news reminds us that racial violence and sexual violence is still too common.

Those who want a society based on authority resist change. Freedom feels like chaos to them. Those who use God to instill fear in others are themselves caught up in fear. They believe their God tells them to bully others as they have been bullied. They believe the threat of punishment and threaten others. Let us love those whose fears cause them to oppose freedom. Tell them that they too can be free from fear from an angry God.

Love feels weak compared to violence. But it is like the water that washes the mountain to the sea. Let us be ambassadors of love, diplomats in a world at war.

Be the peace you want to see in the world. Love the hell out of the world. Let this summer be a reminder that we shall overcome.

FROM THE BOARD PRESIDENT

We have so much going for us here in our UU Church community. A lot of very friendly, very interesting people are coming and going through our doors. We are working together for the maintenance and betterment of our little community. We have an awesome covenant, minister and church building. So, what caused me not long ago to remark that I felt like we were still struggling to be a community? Past Board President Mark VanMeeter offered that we are more like a collection of small communities.

Anthropologists talk about a proposed ideal size for a community that is known as the "Dunbar Number." It is a suggested upper limit to the number of people in a group with whom one can maintain social, stable relationships. These are relationships in which an individual knows who each is and how each person relates to every other person. Our congregation falls around the upper limit of this "Dunbar Number." Proponents of this idea assert that numbers larger than this require more restrictive rules and enforced norms to maintain a cohesive group.

This may sound like anathema to us! Even at this optimum number, cohesion is thought to require devoting around 40 percent of the time to "social grooming." This may indicate a need for us to strive to become more widely and intimately acquainted within our group in order to blur the lines among our collection of small communities and to find more unity within our diversity.

Coincidentally, a team of our members has been working together over the past several months to learn and prepare to implement a practice called Small Group Ministry. The groups of eight to 10 people we will form for our pilot program will be known as Chalice Circles. Each will include trained facilitators and each will decide certain particulars for themselves, such as frequency of meetings and rules of engagement. Sign-up will be this September and meetings will begin in October. These groups will encourage listening over speech making, discussion more than debate, and sharing of personal stories over critique. Hearing one another's stories over time, people become more accepting.

Many UU churches have reported remarkable success with this practice. I'm hoping we can share that experience and become a community that abides.
