FINANCIAL REPORT

As of the end of July 2016, pledge payments and donations are about \$10,000 lower than last year, but building use, fundraising and endowment distributions together offset most of this. Expenditures are also down about \$10,000 from last year. The Finance Committee expects this pattern to continue with savings in office administrator and cleaning service costs. As a result, a year-end budget surplus looks very likely in the absence of new spending initiatives such as a choir director. More detailed 2016 general-fund data are available upon request. I will be on Sabbatical from January 2017 through June 2017. As of this writing I do not know what I will be doing on Sabbatical. If I get a Clergy Renewal Grant from the Lilly Foundation, I will do an extroverted expressive and expensive music project. If not get the grant, I will do an introspective inexpensive exploration of the intersection of Christianity and Unitarian Universalism.

However, I do know what I will be doing as I prepare to leave. A Sabbatical is a time for clergy *AND* congregational renewal. Before I go, I want us to review and renew our commitment to the Seven Principles and Six Sources of Unitarian Universalism. Through a series of sermons and congregational responses, we will explore the meanings of this faith. It is a faith not found in doctrine or dogma. It is a faith found in ourselves and in our interaction with others.

Our focus will be on our how Unitarian Universalism is important to Tippecanoe County, Indiana, the nation, and the world. What we do here is a microcosm of how we want the world to be.

A congregation is a proving ground where we show that it is possible to live in peace.

We seek not the peace of walking on eggshells and avoiding conflict. When love is the spirit of this church we are able to help one another through conflicts and struggles in order to dwell in peace. Inner peace gives us the strength to withstand external conflict.

Exploring our sources may help us find our strength. Principles larger than our individual lives give us hope. Shared hopes beget courage. Even when we are "apart" we will know we are "a part" of something larger that binds us together.

The Committee on Ministry is working with other committees to coordinate the details of the sabbatical. They will help determine who does what tasks and how the congregation will manage in my absence. Watch this space in the newsletter for more information.

GIFT CARD FUNDRAISER

Do you have loved ones who are attending school out of state? Do you need to send a gift for a loved one across the country? Check out the gift card (also known as Scrip Program) monthly fundraiser at the church. Numerous national chains participate in the program. Forms are available in the Narthex and on the desk outside of the office.

Gift cards are available for clothing, groceries, fast food, restaurants, department stores, drug and home improvement stores, gourmet shops, pet supplies, music, movies, sporting goods, toys, housewares as well as online shopping at Overstock.com and Zappos.

Gift card orders are due the third Sunday of the month and available for pickup on the first Sunday of the month.

You will not find an easier way to generate income for the church. All you need to do is buy the gift card through our fundraiser rather than at retail stores. Nothing extra out of your own pocket and you receive the full value of the cards you purchase. The Scrip Program rebates a portion, typically 3-15% of the cost, to the church.

BLACK LIVES MATTER

We acknowledge that continued issues of racism are of extreme concern throughout our nation. The UUA voted in June 2015 that Black Lives Matter be recognized by all member congregations as an "Action of Immediate Witness." This calls us to take action towards education and social justice work on this critical issue.

We join with the Black Lives Matter movement in an effort to raise awareness of the problems of racial oppression affronting people of color every day. We hung a banner declaring "Black Lives Matter" on April 4, 2016, when we hosted our first BLM open house.

We have continued the work since that time through protesting on Purdue campus in July, viewing and discussing three films on race, participating in worship services where the topic was related to white privilege or other racial issues, sharing books on the topic, and Gail and Charlie Davis offered a workshop on the intersectionality of racism and sexism in conjunction with the release of their CD "Skin."

WANTED: NEW UUCTC LOGO

The Unitarian Universalist Church of Tippecanoe County would like to select an official logo for use in all printed and online materials as well as other official representation. Various designs have already been proposed, but after review of those under consideration, we would like to more clearly define what is needed. The design requirements for an official logo are much more specific than for general artwork due to the various ways it must be reproduced and the many materials into which it must be incorporated.

Any designs placed under consideration must be open to modification as we go through the consideration and selection process as well.

Required

Any design must meet all of the following:

- UUCTC will have full rights to the image, including modification and reproduction
- Scalable Vector Graphics (SVG) original
- Maximum of 4 colors, no gradients
- Coloring options for both light/white and dark/black backgrounds
- Simple design that will look good at a wide range of scales

Preferred

Designs which can meet more of the following will be preferred:

- No text/letters
- Aspect ratio close to 1:1
- No more than 2 non-white/black colors
- Smooth curves and/or straight edges
- High degree of visibility and recognizability

Suggested

The following thematic elements may be considered for inclusion, but are not required:

- Flaming chalice
- River

Designs will be reviewed by the Board of Trustees, who will select a final design and may work with the designer to incorporate any requested changes.
