PRESIDENT'S COLUMN

Who Owns Our Church Building

In the last meeting of our Board of Trustees, I asked the question, "who owns our church building?" Most of us thought it was something like joint ownership between all of the members, but that answer requires some qualification, as in fact the church building is not really owned by its membership.

Members of a congregation do not own their church building as stockholders own a business. A congregation may not distribute its resources for the personal benefit of anyone. Nor can they sell the church property, pay the debts, and divide the proceeds among themselves. The most fundamental principle of non-profits is that they must use their resources exclusively for the specific purposes for which the state chartered them.

From this standpoint the owner that the board must serve is the congregation's mission, or the covenant that the congregation has set its heart to. Love is the spirit of this church, and service is its law. This is our covenant.

As we tend to have very specific and confining notions about ownership in this culture, I thought this would be useful to ponder.
