**FEBRUARY 23:** Beena Sebastian of the Cultural Academy for Peace (CAP), Kochi, India, is visiting the United States at the invitation of Cultural Connections: Women Weaving Worlds, Founder, Deanna Brown. Beena will present *Being the Change: From India to Indiana: Human Rights and Gender Justice*. Through the lens of her own history and the many programs of Cultural Academy, Beena will share ways that she actively works to transform systems of violence and models of domination into ones of peace and justice for all. A number of women from UUC have traveled with Deanna to India over the past 3-4 years. Each trip includes extended time with Beena, the staff, women & children associated with Cultural Academy for Peace.
