The Conversation Project was started by Ellen Goodman (Pulitzer Prize winning columnist) and colleagues after experiencing the confusion, pain and grief of trying to help a family member or friend during a critical time....not knowing what the person really wanted. They (and we) believe that the place for this to begin is at the kitchen table (or on a walk, or wherever) with the people we love, before it's too late.
