- FORUM, 9 AM Rae Schnapp, Ph.D., presents “Re-Energizing Green Sanctuary at the UU Church. With climate change showing itself to truly be a global problem with strong social justice consequences, the UU Social Justice Committee has decided to renew its support for the Green Sanctuary program. Rae will describe the Green Sanctuary Program after a 23min David Suzuki video on climate change. SUNDAY 1 JUNE

- FORUM, 9 AM Larry Loring Nies, Professor of Environmental & Ecological Engineering & Civil Engineering, Purdue University, presents “Water Use in the Wabash River Watershed.” Increasing demand for freshwater makes it necessary to find innovative means to extend the life of our water resources and to manage them in a sustainable way. An analysis of the current status of water use and indirect water reuse is a critical function for meeting fresh water demands, facilitating water resources planning, protecting human health, and freshwater ecosystems conservation. Although, water data are being collected and stored by different federal and regional entities there is no holistic watershed scale assessment of water use occurring. An initial assessment was performed for the Wabash River Watershed. Results show that during the low flow months of July-October, treated water discharges into the Wabash River contributed

- FORUM, (cont'd.) 70 to 100% of the Wabash River stream flow volume. This indicates that essentially all of the Wabash River water is extracted, used and returned to the river. Thus, at the watershed scale water use and reuse is significant. Moreover, proposals to divert treated wastewater to consumptive uses such as landscape or agricultural irrigation would have substantial ecological impacts.
