Lighted Chalice

A Financial Overview By John Carlson

There are mixed messages in the church financial data for 2017.

Pledge payments and donations are down for the second straight year to the lowest level since 2011.
Other revenues climbed primarily because of amazing volunteer fund-raising efforts.

About 9 percent of 2017 pledges have not been paid as of the end of the year. Based on prior experience, some of that will be received in early 2018. In addition, there were notable donations by households that did not turn in a 2017 pledge card, so total



"pledge payments" exceeded the total pledged.

The good news is that there was a small budget surplus for the year. This was made possible in part by not hiring a choir director, by good weather that kept utility expenses well below budget, and by many volunteered services to the church. With savings in several other

accounts, we were able to set aside the \$6,100 budgeted contribution to the Sabbatical/Search Fund.

As a result of the surplus, the church enters 2018 with a General Fund balance of slightly over \$50,000, so there is no reason at this early point in the year to be terribly concerned about the 2018 budget.

Securing Childcare

making it easier to request childcare for events.

Congregants may complete a paper form or visit the UUCTC's website, www.uuctc.org, go to Policies and then click on "Request Childcare."

Submit requests two weeks before the event. The person completing the form will need to provide details on:

- Event Date, Time, and Duration
- Estimated number of expected children and age ranges
- Type of event
- Contact information for event chair
