15 DECEMBER 2013 CONGREGATIONAL MEETING RESULTS

Board President Mark VanMeeter opened the meeting after distributing copies of the proposed budget and the minutes from the last congregational meeting. Mark provided a detailed overview of the budget. With the current level of pledges and non-pledge income projected there will be a short fall in revenue for 2014. The estimated \$6357.00 would have to come from the remaining capital funds. A motion to operate under an interim budget until late January opened further discussion.

The discussion led to suggestions for generating non-pledge revenue:

- Form a group to generate ideas for increasing non-pledge and building use revenue. Mark agreed to be the point person and Beth Misner agreed to be on the committee.
- There will be a brainstorming session in mid-January exploring revenue sources.
- There will be a congregational meeting in late January, tentatively scheduled for January 26, to approve the revised budget

Motion was made to defer the vote on the budget until the congregational meeting Sunday, January 26. Motion carried. Mark VanMeeter, President, Board of Trustees Dorothy Hughes, Board Secretary

Joel is an accomplished puppeteer, occasional director, and novice actor. A native of Shreveport, Louisiana, Joel has a B.A. in English from Northwestern State University of Louisiana and an M.F.A. in Theatre from the University of Houston, where he served as a production intern with Houston Ballet. He was a 2011 recipient of the Charles B. Murphy Award for Outstanding Undergraduate Teaching, Purdue University's highest undergraduate teaching honor. His research and teaching specialties are the history and development of period and regional style and adornment in Western civilization. Joel and his partner Michael Wallace live in West Lafayette. Workshop rotation teachers share a passion or something they have knowledge about with our 1st-4th graders. Optimally, teachers will volunteer for three weeks, rotating between the three classes (1st-2nd grades meet together).
