With deepest sorrow, we inform you of the death of Fritz Smith, UU Church Board of Trustees President from 2008-2009. Fritz had very recently been ill and was undergoing tests which were inconclusive. Friends took him to St. Elizabeth E.R. Sunday, March 16 where he was admitted to the hospital and taken to I.C.U. On Monday morning, March 17 test results revealed that he had metastasized cancer throughout. He passed away at 7:30 Tuesday morning, March 18, 2014. A memorial service is planned at the UU Church for Sunday, May 18, 2:00 pm.

UU CHURCH NAME CHANGE FOR MARKETING/SOCIAL MEDIA PURPOSES

The official name of our congregation is "Unitarian Universalist Church, Inc." This is not specific enough for marketing. For marketing purposes we are trying to add a locator to our name. We want this to be unique and specific. "Greater Lafayette," which has been used in the past, is not unique because there are so many Lafayettes. "West Lafayette" is too specific, as it excludes people from outside of West Lafayette. "Tippecanoe County" may be the right balance of uniqueness and specificity. For a trial period, beginning immediately and ending in December 2014, we will be increasingly using the name "Unitarian Universalist Church, Tippecanoe County" in our outreach. Four weeks each year, we help our partner church, Our Savior Lutheran, which provides overnight accommodations to families in the program. Individual volunteers can help out by simply cooking a dinner and dropping it off, serving as host (at the OSLC) for a few hours in the evening, or even by staying overnight.
