Ministers Musing

Sabbatical for all!

I had planned to start my sabbatical in June 2016. It will now begin in January 2017. This allows the congregation to apply for a grant from the Lilly Foundation. That will help the congregation cover the costs while I am gone and will help me fund my activities during sabbatical.

Lilly Foundation Grant Proposals

The grants are granted to congregations and ministers who collaborate on a project.

In light of that I am making three proposals. Whichever generates the greatest enthusiasm and participation from the Congregation will be the focus.

1. Music in Congregations.

I will focus on recording music around the theme of spirituality and emotions. A curriculum and a worship will be developed for each CD.

Congregational possibilities:

- * Survey congregation about how music affects the congregations.
- * Invite a variety of UU musicians to do concerts, workshops and Sunday services.
- * Work on hymn singing.
- * Create a songbook featuring songs by local musicians and songs in the public domain.
- * Explore music programs with children.

2. UU Ecological Co-Housing.

I will live at a variety of UU and other co-housing sites. I will focus on small ecological homes. I may also take classes in alternative energy systems. The community ultimately would invite seniors who are downsizing, working people who are seeking to simplify, and young families who are seeking to own their first home. The goal would be to foster a community diverse in age, ethnicity, and income. I may also take classes in alternative energy systems.

Congregational possibilities:

- *Explore the educational governmental and private companies that might be interested in a collaborative project.
- *Develop covenants that could hold a diverse community together and foster interaction.

3. Translating Christianity for Unitarian Universalists

This project would help Unitarian Universalist connect with their Judeo-Christian heritage and create a bridge to foster work with liberal congregations in the area. I would compile a group of Bible selections using three translations; the King James Version, and two paraphrases of my own development. The primary contrast between the versions would be how God is named.

President's Column

The church budget was submitted to membership at the all-church meeting on December 13 and was approved for the first quarter of 2016.

This is pending review by the Board and Congregation in March of 2016. The full minutes of this meeting will soon be sent by email to the church membership.

The main reason for the first quarter review relates to the uncertainty in the outcome of our stewardship campaign.

If all the pledges that are still out, pledge at the same rate as last year, we will reach the \$233,000 shown in the budget. At that point we will still show a deficit of about \$11,000. However, there will be more in the beginning balance than the projected deficit for 2016.

Committees have been careful in spending church money and savings have also been realized by generous donations in kind and from many volunteer services. The money to fully fund the 2017 Sabbatical has been taken from surplus funds and placed in the Sabbatical Fund.

When all pledges have been received, we will tailor our church budget to the funds available, and seek consensus from the membership about the changes that might imply.
