<u>C4C</u> The March/April Change For Change beneficiary is Riggs Community Health Center, located in Lafayette. In 2013, 90% of all Riggs patients were below 200% of the Federal Poverty Level and 30% of patients were uninsured. 26% of Center patients are Hispanic. All services are offered in a culturally sensitive environment. To ensure optimal care, interpreters are provided and Center documents are provided in both English and Spanish. Riggs prenatal patients accounted for 33% of all Tippecanoe County births in 2011. Riggs has about 900 to 1000 mothers in prenatal care and 6,000 children in their care most of whom are on Medicaid. On March 22, Sally Watlington, Board Chair Emerita, will speak at Sunday Forum.
