August-September Change for Change: LUM Summer Camp

The August-September Change for Change beneficiary is LUM Summer Camp at Hanging Rock Camp in Warren County. The camp is an overnight camp for boys and girls ages 8-10 who come from families served by Lafayette Urban Ministry. Camp includes all the traditional activities a great camp should: morning chapel, horseback riding, swimming, hiking, campfires and an outstanding staff of camp counselors. Along with these comes a focus on education. The camp will teach about the wildlife, trees and plants that are native to our area. The theme is "For the Beauty of the Earth." Campers will learn from Purdue Forestry and entomology experts. Indiana Department of Natural Resource staff will educate the campers about local wildlife. Reading assignments will include stories of people who have dedicated their lives to the conservation of our natural resources. There are online computer challenges in math, hands-on workshops in science and some serious time set aside for campers to delve into their favorite chapter books.
