Interim Search Update

The Interim Task Force is busy working with the UUA to identify an interim minister. Here is a short bulleted list to let everyone know about the process and what we've been doing:

- The process is fast paced, requires rapid response, is more "matching" than "choosing", and is administered and guided by the UUA Transitions Office.
- We were told that there are more congregations in search, than ministers seeking a position.
- An interim ministry sets the stage for, and is different than, a "called" or "settled" ministry.
- It's done in 3 "rounds" of applicant matching to congregations, interviewing, and offers.
- Following the on-demand, time intensive work of the Interim Task Force, a separate

Transitions Team will work with the Interim Minister, providing the opportunity to engage a more diverse and larger group of our congregants. Later, there will be a Settled Minister search committee.

The Interim Task Force timeline, to

- interviews with ministers and references conducted May 1-8.
- Provided summary/ recommendations at monthly Board Meeting Tuesday May 8th.
- Offer(s) made through the Transition Office May 9.
- We were not matched with an interim minister in round 1 (notified May 11).

- Congregational survey answers compiled and used for input for the online application. (Note: We will be sharing the survey feedback with the congregation as time permits.)
- Information gathering resulted in application completed and submitted April 17th.
- Ministers' Records studied.

- May 14 we were notified of the candidate for "round 2", and the interviewing repeats.
- The Transitions Office is working on a plan to help the 15 congregations still in search

Statement from UUA Regarding an Interim Ministry Position:

It is understood, in accordance with the established policy of the Unitarian Universalist Association, that the interim minister is pledged not to become a candidate for the congregation's called ministry, not to serve the congregation for more than two years (with a limited exception for interim ministers of religious education and interim associate and assistant ministers), and not to discuss specific prospective candidates for the called ministry of the congregation with the ministerial search committee.

It is also understood that interim ministers both carry out the normal responsibilities of congregational ministry, including worship and pastoral care, and also assist the congregation in addressing the following interim tasks:

- •claiming and honoring its past and engaging and acknowledging its grief and conflicts
- •recognizing its unique identity and its strengths, needs, and challenges
- •understanding the appropriate leadership roles of minister(s), church staff, and lay leaders and navigating the shifts in leadership that may accompany times of transition
- •making appropriate use of regional, UUA, and other outside resources
- •renewing its vision, strengthening its stewardship, preparing for new growth and new professional leadership, ready to embrace the future with anticipation and zest

A hearty crew of UUCTC volunteers helped transform the huge piles of donations into an organized and inviting display of merchandise for the annual UUCTC Rummage Sale fundraiser. This is our annual 'repurpose' event, matching unwanted item with new owners as we raise funds to support our church.

The sale started at 7:00 Saturday morning. When workers arrived at 6:50 there were easily 25 shoppers waiting in line in the playground area to access the potential treasures.

Much of the joy of the rummage sale is interacting with the customers as they express their delight with their newfound treasures. It is also rewarding to think about the possibility of our UU belongings spreading UU



At first it seemed a daunting task due to what seemed to be the overwhelming volume donated this year. Remarkably, the hardworking and steady crew had everything unpacked in about day and a half. This gave the organizing/pricing crew a few days to make the displays more attractive, separate out the more valuable items for our boutique section, price all the items, and get price sheets and signs printed and placed.

Though it may sound like work to you, working the rummage sale is also about fun and community building with the volunteers. I had the joy of getting to know about a dozen congregants better as we worked together like a well-oiled machine laying out all the donated merchandise. We worked *and* laughed together. They had the

energy into hundreds of homes in the community.

A new strategy this year was to have a table of free items composed of lesser value items such as vases, plastic water bottles, VHS tapes, CDs, DVDs, miscellaneous items, including some item we could not identify. Many shoppers were delighted with the opportunity to select some things for free.



One of our late-in-the-day shoppers shared a great idea involving partnering with local women's shelters or municipal organizations to have case managers come and take away items that would be of use to displaced families. We hope to follow up on that idea next year.



The day after the sale, we provided forum and church attendees the opportunity to shop before and after service. I cannot emphasize strongly enough what a great crew of helpers there were this year. I am deeply grateful for their assistance with setup, organizing, promotion, pricing, shop keeping, and cleanup.

Our office administrator created colorful signs, so shoppers could easily see the pricing structure, and was instrumental in the design and placement of some of our free and paid ads.

I could not have asked for a better, more efficient and effective group of people on this project. That we netted more than \$700 over the planned goal is a bonus. Chestnut Street Mercantile, formerly known as Surplus and Salvage, picked up our leftovers.

All loose change (\$25.24) was donated to the church's Change for Change program.
