

As UUCTC transitions to an interim minister this fall there are changes coming in the welcoming ministry. - Have a larger greeting team so one can be stationed outside and one to show new people around the building as needed.
- Training greeters how to answer FAQs for new arrivals.



## How can I earn money for the ministry/circle?

All dates are first come, first served.

Church groups get half the take for their budget, the other half goes into the church general budget. If no group claims a game date, then all of the income goes to the general budget. The games that are expected to draw more fans will require more people to work the parking - small crowd days can be done with 1-3 people (ideally at least 2) while large crowd days may are best done with 5 -6.
