

# Topic: Trends in Theoretical Physics, new ideas for old problems

Certain basic problems in theoretical physics today are the same that have concerned humans since ancient times. In this talk I am going to discuss our current understanding of those problems, and present recent theoretical ideas that have changed our view of the Universe. Those include extra dimensions, black holes, quantum mechanics, and string theory. Some surprising ideas include the possibility that the number of dimensions of a system can be changed, and that information can leak from black holes.


