

The World is Ablaze

The world is ablaze!

Stand in awe of the wonders creation has to offer as the leaves show us beauty letting go, and the waves take us on a ride to who knows where while our minds are on fire with pain and torment each time we dare to open our eyes to the blaze of the world.

Have we suffered enough?

When will the fire illuminate our way?

Is the blaze under our feet holy ground?

Soon will our cries of torment be answered with the

cool waters of human kindness?

What about now? Is the tide turning?

Hope is also present with each smile, each harvest gathered, each kind word spoken, and each consideration given.

We have so much to give, so much to offer, and we have power!

May we find and use our power with might and love.

Indeed, the world is ablaze, and it seems to also be on a fast track. I can't keep up, but it is not the time to give up as there is much we can do. Rev. Susan Frederick-Gray, the president of the UUA states, 'this is no time for a casual faith.' What does she mean by that? Perhaps she means that now is the time that we Unitarian Universalists acknowledge that we have something really amazing to offer the world. Our principles, sources and theologies entice us to join the ranks that are speaking up against what the powers that be are trying to silence within us. It seems endless and exhausting, daunting and draining, and much more than any one person can do alone. Sometimes feeling hopeless and helpless is inevitable, sometimes feeling

powerful is too far out of our grasp, and sometimes we just want to cover our heads and pretend everyone has shelter, food, and full human rights and dignity. But this is not the case, and if you feel like it's just too much, well, that's because it is. So where do we find the strength to carry on and not fall into complacency? John O'Donahue in his book Anam Cara, points out that we are not able to do this work without having others close to us on our journey. We need each other. That is why being part of something bigger than ourselves is so important. We need others around us to help us gain the strength to withstand the news, to open our eyes to the suffering of the world, and

sometimes just to make it to the end of the day. There is a need for balance in our lives so that we can periodically fight back, and then let others resist on our behalf when it is our turn to rest. It is important, especially now in these turbulent times to be aware, to be 'woke' as some call it. But the world is ablaze and if we do not pay attention to our own needs the holy ground we walk upon will consume us, and then we aren't any good to anyone. So, what can we do? There are a lot of opportunities to support causes, to march, to get involved, to act. However, where do we get our cues to take good care of ourselves? How do we keep from burning out? I think that being part of a community like this one is integral. Surrounding ourselves with people that love us and lift us up is also important. There are a thousand ways to kneel and kiss the ground, and all of these ways can help us rejuvenate our spirits, to buttress us up to withstand the gale force winds of the news cycle. It is recommended that we set limits on how long we spend on social media and watching the news. Also, we can find comfort in what Mary Oliver tells us: 'You do not have to be good. You do not have to walk on your knees for a hundred miles through the desert, repenting. You only have to let the soft animal of your body love what it loves.' And just like most social animals, we can't do this alone. Reach out to one another, get support from your loved ones, voice your fears and concerns, have good and deep conversations with one another, become refreshed in the inner sanctuary of your being, and then when you can, fight the good fight.




