milestone, joy, sorrow or illness, please contact a member of the committee. We serve on the committee to enhance our spiritual connection with each other, to tend




to each other's needs and help nurture our souls. In the words of each other?" Pastoral Care is led by Kathy Willowoode and the following



For example, Unitarian Clement Clarke Moore wrote the now famous, "The Night Before Christmas", and it was Unitarian Charles Dickens who wrote "A Christmas Carol."
