On Saturday, December 8, UUCTC hosted LUM Jubilee Christmas. Jubilee Christmas has been occurring annually for 35 years.

The holiday season can be incredibly stressful and a major financial burden to families living below the poverty line. For Jubilee, our church and many others in the area adopt families and purchase multiple nice new gifts for the children.

Many members of our congregation bought gifts from which the parents were able to choose for their children. LUM provided a ham for each family, food cards, and Target gift cards for the teenage children. Our church also purchased for each family non-food items such as toilet paper, paper towels, dish

soap, laundry soap, bar soap, toothpaste, toothbrushes, sponges, multi-purpose cleaning solution, hand sanitizer, and a holiday towel. The Lafayette Quilters Guild donated a unique handmade quilt for each family.

We collaborated with Lafayette Church of the Brethren and Lafayette Friends Meeting. We served 14 families and 39 children. At the event, our invited minister, Rosemary Morrison, spoke about the spirit of the holiday season. The Lafayette Church of the Brethren Pastor Steven Crain spoke about the



meaning of jubilee, a time when slaves and prisoners would be freed and debts would be forgiven. The Lafayette Chamber Singers sang two carols. Then, the shopping began. Each parent was able to leave with three nice presents for each child, three stocking stuffers for each child, a ham, food cards, gift cards for teenage children, and a basket of practical items along with a handmade quilt. It was a pleasure to work alongside Jada Haughey, who has been coordinating this event for the past few years. We would like to thank everyone who participated in buying gifts, contacting and welcoming families, setting up, greeting, working in the kitchen, and all of the unmentioned things that went into making this event a success. This was truly a collective effort that has a made a great difference in our community.

OWL (Our Whole Lives) is a sexuality education curriculum that equips participants with accurate, age-appropriate information. All OWL facilitators are

comprehensively trained through the UUA (Unitarian Universalist Association).

In order for a child to participate in the program, families must attend



a mandatory orientation session. At the orientation session, the teaching facilitators will introduce families to the curriculum and philosophy of the program. The orientation is scheduled for January 20th from 12:30-1:30pm for prek-2nd/3rd graders/families and 1:45-2:45pm for 3rd/4th-6th graders/families. Snacks will be provided. Registration deadline is Sunday, January 13th. Please note that if your child is a 3rd grader, consult the facilitators and/or workshop topics. to determine the best placement for your child. Also note that the schedule is subject to change at the facilitators' discretion and every effort will be made to contact you in the event of a cancellation.

All classes will be held at UUCTC (333 Meridian St. in West Lafayette) in room 101/103. See below for schedule and workshop topic list. 
