Follow one African-American boy through the course of his day as the harsh reality of segregation and racial prejudice comes into vivid focus.

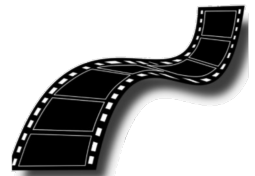
