First, though, let's take a look at where we are in this time in the life of UUCTC. The interim period is a time of reflection, of healing, and of anticipation. There are five essential tasks the congregation must undertake in order for a search to be successful. By successful, I mean by May of 2021, UUCTC will have a signed contract with a minister everyone is feeling great about. During the interim period, a congregation has work to do. It is the congregation's work, not the interim minister's work, not any one individual's work. It is the congregation's work to do *together*. They boil down to the following five essential tasks:

- 1. Claiming and honoring its past and healing its griefs and conflicts.
- 2. Illuminating the congregation's unique identity, its strengths, its needs, and its challenges.
- 3. Clarifying the multiple dimensions of leadership, both ordained and lay, and navigating the shifts in leadership that accompany times of transition.
- 4. Renewing connections with available resources within and beyond the UUA.

5. Enabling the congregation to renew its vision, strengthen its stewardship, prepare for new professional leadership, and engage its future with anticipation and zest.



Over the next year, there will be many opportunities for each and every one of you to engage with these tasks. My job is to create the opportunities, while the job of each member and friend is to participate as fully as they are able.

May we work together over the coming year to create a healthy, trusting, and vibrant community. My prayer for this congregation is that you will be blessed in 2021 with an amazing and dynamic new minister. The work is set before us, let us take up this mantle together.






Change for Change is Changing!

First, thank you, everyone, for your generous contributions to our Change for Change project! We raised \$155.16 for the Group Home For Children and \$271.32 for Heartford House! In an effort to raise *even more* money for our chosen Change for Change charities, Change for Change is changing starting in January for a four-month trial period.

Instead of only the *change* in the collection plates going to our charities, half of all uncommitted cash will go to our designated charitable organization. This means any dollar bills or coins not in labeled envelopes, or loose in the plate, will be divided between the charitable organization and our church donations. This means if you put in a tendollar bill, five dollars will go to our Change for Change recipient, and five dollars will go to the general revenue of our church. You can still write a check if you would like to, just put it in an envelope, and mark it Change For Change (or C4C, its abbreviation). Please also note C4C on the memo line of your check.
