Video Tips:

- Use the front facing camera in panoramic/ landscape/horizontal view.
- You should receive to your left and pass off to your right. (The final product will look like you're passing from right to left because of mirror view.)
- Please pause when you receive the flower, hold it in front of you, and pass off the flower. You will want to leave your arm off the screen for an extended period of time to help with editing.
- Be creative if you'd like. Feel free to pause in the middle and do something with your flower. If you don't have a flower, feel free to use a plant or fake flower.
- Let me know if you have questions or need technical help.

The videos will be shared to our virtual Zoom service, FB live service, and private FB groups. Please do NOT send a video if you do not give permission for us to share in those ways. I was really disappointed when the public health crisis forced us to cancel the in-person premier of *Uncivil War*, a documentary about voter suppression that features a segment on Indiana gerrymandering and our grassroots fight to reform redistricting. And although we had hoped to reschedule a live event, for the near future at least we need to maintain social distancing, making that impossible.

So, with the assistance of the Bertelsman Foundation, who produced the film, we are excited to invite you to the **virtual premiere of Uncivil War on Thursday, June 18 at 7 p.m. Please RSVP at** <u>https://actionnetwork.org/events/uncivil-war-online-screening?link_id=0&can_id=ae7394f13225e41455c54083ff788e54&source=email-will-you-join-us-online-june-18th&email_referrer=email_825908&email_subject=will-you-join-us-online-june-18th</u>

No need to leave your house. Just click the link above to register and the morning of the event we will email you a link. Right before 7 p.m. on June 18th, you can click on the link and join voting rights advocates from around the state in viewing this important film. After the film, which runs 55 minutes, you will get the opportunity to participate in a panel discussion with the filmmaker and Indiana voting rights activists.

Uncivil War is directed by Indiana native Tom Glynn and in interviews with experts, politicians and activists (including me!) it examines our system of government and lays bare the very real risks facing our democracy. From disinformation campaigns to voter suppression and gerrymandering, *Uncivil War* makes it clear that voters in Indiana, and across the country, are vulnerable to these attacks.

In addition to being an important opportunity for us to educate our community about voter suppression and its impact on our state, the funds raised at the screening will be dedicated to our public mapping website project. The best way we can combat partisan gerrymandering in Indiana next year is to make the process transparent and inclusive of all Hoosiers.

This is particularly relevant right now as the 2020 Census and next year's round of redistricting are coming up. I hope you will be able to join us for this important event.

Here are a few practical suggestions for developing inclusive environments for our very young children in which diversity is valued:



We should take an inventory of our home diversity. Making it a point to buy dolls and enjoy media of every race, gender, and providing inclusion of those with disability. While doing so, making certain these are created by members of those groups to support them and to avoid exposing children to generalized or stereotypical content. We should learn to recognize our own racial biases. Being careful with the language we use around our children. We should continually look for opportunities to respectfully immerse our families in other cultures. We can then work at keeping an open a dialogue about how that feels. We should listen and observe. We can let children know that we are a safe people to process their feelings and reactions with.
